The Committee discussed beginning the ADA surveys. Dave Cotter will do the five (5) surveys for the trail areas. John Sasur: Urban Trail Presentation

John Sasur attended today's meeting to present a proposal for an Urban Walking Trail to the Committee and request it be added to the OSRP as a priority area for recreational development. The trail would follow the Ware River from Thorndike to Three Rivers, and pass several Native American historical sites on the way, including the Indian Weir. The Wenimisset Trail would appear to be an appropriate name for this trail based on the historical significance of the area. The trail could be a loop trail (1.6mi walk already on sidewalk) and would also serve as a vital connection trail to larger more diverse trail system in the area. The trail would also provide an easily accessible, widely available and low-cost opportunity to meet the educational, historical and environmental science needs of our students within our community schools such as the nearby Old Mill Pond School, Palmer High and Pathfinder Regional School.

Benefits of the trail include:

- Foster a more active and healthy lifestyle
- Strengthen the social and family fabric of the residents of Palmer Physical activity that would improve physical and mental health, and reduce stress
- Provide easy access for young and old
- Increase property values throughout the town by offering a nearby recreational opportunity
- Enhance our appreciation of Palmer's unique natural and cultural heritage
- Provide a way to connect the villages of Palmer

Sasur has done the majority of the work for this already, including identifying all property owners along the proposed trail corridor and identifying areas of access issues, including the railroad crossing. 95% of the trail area is owned by the Town already, there are few parcels the town would need to either acquire or develop an access easement with.

Discuss Community Visioning Forum

The Community Visioning Session is scheduled on May 20th from 6pm-8pm. Angela Panaccione has reserved the room at the Library. The room holds 100 people. Angela Panaccione has had a press release run in the Palmer Journal and has add the event to the town website and the Community Events Calendar. and Dave Cotter have hung the community visioning flyers around town.

Jaimye Bartak has supplied an Agenda for the Committee to review. Angela Panaccione suggested reviewing the goals and objectives first. Dave Cotter though doing the mapping first would be a better idea, to orientate people to place. Alice Davey agreed to do mapping first, so participants' could map areas that are of importance then get into the goals and objectives discussion.

Jaimye Bartak has supplied a map for Committee to review. Jim Ostrout suggested a more generic map, with limited information present would be better, that way participants could fill the map in themselves and the moderators could get a better sense of what residents knew currently existed for open space and recreational areas in town. Bartak will simplify the map and send it to Panaccione for final review.

Public Survey Discussion

Very low survey responses compared to previous plans. There were a little over 200 respondents, with 2/3 being women. Making the assumption the women complete one survey for an entire family/per household.

The main areas highlighted by the survey, which mirrored the Community Visioning Session, were more access to the rivers and more for families and teens. Also maintain existing parks and conservation lands was a top priority. Many residents felt the town should fix what we have before we try to get more.

Renovating Burleigh Park was also another major area residents felt needed improvement. Jim Ostrout found old playground equipment he is currently looking for assembly directions fpr and desires to put the equipment in Burleigh Park. Many residents wanted facilities and lights back at Burleigh, as well as increasing safety there and curbing the area for teen drug use.

Surveying on Election Day did not go as planned. Angela Panaccione and Jim Ostrout got tied up with other things. Conservation interns Tharyn Nein-Large and Sara Bourder worked polls from 10am-4pm. No one was there at either location from 4-8pm. Dave was going to do 8am-10am, but polls did not open until 10am.

Discuss Community Visioning Forum

The Community Visioning Session was held on May 20th from 6pm-8pm. Very low turnout, only 15 people attended. Again, River access was a main focal point of discussions; as well as renovating Burleigh Park. There are 4 rivers in town, with very little access on any of them. Most attendees wanted to see a canoe or kayak launch, picnic areas and walking trails.

Trail maintenance, clean up and marking was also discussed a lot; as well as establishing a town website for the Trail Committee.

Jaimye Bartak will be incorporating the major discussion points from the visioning session into the overall goals and objectives (Chapter 8).

Discuss Community Preservation Act (CPA)

The Committee discussed the Community Preservation Act (CPA) and possible ways to propose it to Town Council and the voters. The CPA would create a local Community Preservation Fund for open space protection, historic preservation, affordable housing and outdoor recreation raised locally through the imposition of a surcharge against real property. It was proposed in Palmer in the past, but failed due to the high 3% tax levy and lack of exemptions. Recent 2012 amendments to the legislation allow communities to propose it with a tax rate of as low as 1% and several new exemptions for low income, elderly, commercial and agricultural.

Linda Leduc believes the effort to pass it has to be a grass roots effort and should not come from the town itself. If it was proposed and campaigned through the trails committee, recreation department, historical committee or local farm groups; with support of local town government it would have a better chance of passing. Alice Davey agreed it needs to be a community effort and not a town proposition. Donald Blais did encourage bringing it up to town council to have it placed on next year's ballot. Linda Leduc felt it needs to be on the ballot at the right time. It should not go on with any Proposition 2 ¹/₂ votes and should probably wait until after the police department is paid for as well. If the CPA is proposed with other questions that also aim to raise taxes, than the likelihood of it passing significantly decreases.

Angela Panaccione stated she has a lot of information and handouts she developed for Brimfield outlining the benefits of the CPA and breaking down exactly what a tax would look like and the benefits of adopting the legislation. She determined in Brimfield, it would only raise taxes by \$32/year based on the average assessed value of the homes in town. She could develop the same handout for Palmer as well, with exact figures for cost increases. The handout could then be mailed to town residents as a flyer to begin education.

Linda Leduc also recommended holding informational sessions about the CPA, where representatives from the state Community Preservation Coalition would come and discuss with interested residents. Or possibly attending meetings of the trail committee, rec committee, etc. and presenting it there. A large part of passing the legislation is community education and awareness. The CPA needs to be presented as more of an investment than a tax.

Several town residents were present at the hearing, as well as Charles Blanchard Town Manager and Andrew Golas, Assistant Town Manager. Overall, there was strong public support for the

plan. Many residents expressed their approval of the plan and thanked the Committee for their hard work and effort. No specific or written comments were submitted.

The main discussion of the evening centered on renovations to Burleigh Park. Residents offered suggestions to the Committee of further improvements that could occur there. These included:

- Form a Sub-Committee strictly dealing with Burleigh Park renovations
- Develop a brochure for Burleigh listing activities available
- Re-develop/mark trails there and make a trail map
- Fix up Pavilion, picnic area and horse shoe pits
- Re-open restroom facilities
- Increase night security at the park to deter vandalism
- Promote what is there
- Make ADA accessible walking trail there for both disabled and elderly
- Add more park benches

Other general Public Comments Included:

- All age groups are well represented within the plan
- Advisory Committee should meet monthly, in the evenings and invite the public. This will help build a volunteer base for Open Space protection
- Important the Community stays involved and has the opportunity to do so
- Important to secure grants and funding, and especially important to work toward the passage of the Community Preservation Act (CPA)
