

## REPORT OF THE PALMER POLICE DEPARTMENT – 2001

In 2001, the Palmer Police Department answered approximately 11,891 calls for service. From these calls, 2,291 criminal offenses were recorded and investigated. Additionally, 816 individuals were arrested and/or summoned to court. The department responded to 713 various alarm calls. More than 3,569 traffic offenses were recorded and 480 traffic accidents investigated. These accidents resulted in injuries to 193 individuals, including 3 fatalities. A complete statistical report of the year's activity follows this report.

The department is currently comprised of 21 full-time and 6 part-time police officers, who are supported by 6 full-time non-sworn staff. The following personnel changes occurred during the year:

- o In May, Administrative Assistant left the department to take a job in the private sector.
- o A promotional examination for the position of sergeant was held in October. We anticipate that this promotion will be made in the first half of 2002.

The department received the following grants in 2001:

Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (U.S. Department of Justice, Bureau of Justice Assistance) - \$15,871 to be used for equipment, technology and other materials directly related to basic law enforcement functions.

Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) Grant (Massachusetts Executive Office of Public Safety) - \$9,700 to assist in funding our very successful and beneficial D.A.R.E. program.

Community Policing Grant (Massachusetts Executive Office of Public Safety) - \$23,000 to aid in the development, implementation, and maintenance of community policing programs and initiatives.

OUI, Speed and Seat Belt Enforcement Grant (Governor's Highway Safety Bureau) - \$3,000 to assist in traffic patrols which focus on drunk driving, speed and seat belt enforcement and education.

In February, the police department, in conjunction with the Eastern Hampden County Narcotics Task Force and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) served arrest warrants on 14 individuals residing in Palmer and the surrounding communities. These arrests resulted from an intensive 6-month investigation involving the Palmer and Wilbraham Police Departments and the DEA. This was the largest drug investigation ever undertaken by the police department to date.

The defendants in these cases are being prosecuted in federal and state courts. As of this writing, many of the defendants have been convicted and are serving prison sentences. I would like to acknowledge the work of Detective Sergeant Scott Haley. His dedication and diligence was responsible, in large part, for the success of this operation. Our thanks, too, to the DEA who provided an unprecedented commitment of their resources to this local problem.

We are in the second year of our federal COPS in Schools grant. Officer James Lynch is assigned full-time to the Palmer High School and Pathfinder Regional Vocational Technical High School as the School Resource Officer. The program has received high ratings from the

respective school administrations and the students. My compliments to Officer Lynch for his commitment to this program.

In September, a Special Election was held which asked voters to approve a Debt Exclusion Override of Proposition 2 ½ to fund the construction of a new police station. Unfortunately, for a variety of reasons, the ballot question was defeated. After this vote, the Police Station Building Committee was dissolved by the Board of Selectmen. Shortly thereafter, the Board reorganized the committee, which is now working to prepare another presentation for future consideration by voters. We are hoping to submit this new proposal by later summer 2002, so it may be included on a ballot in the fall. I would like to thank the building committee for their 2 years of dedicated service to this project. The members devoted many hours of their free time toward research, meeting attendance and public education. Their commitment will not be forgotten.

We will continue our quest to acquire a new facility for the Police Department. It should be painfully obvious to everyone by now that a facility is desperately needed and should be the priority capital improvement project for the town. We look forward to the challenge of preparing a proposal that will satisfy both the needs of the department and the ability of the town to fund the project.

In order to satisfy our critical need for space, voters at a special town meeting in the fall appropriated \$50,000 to purchase and install a mobile office trailer for the Police Department. This trailer, which should be installed by late spring of 2002, will provide approximately 800 square feet of additional space. While this will provide some room, for which we are grateful, this is only a temporary solution to our problem. Once we occupy this space, we will have a total of about 2,800 square feet of space in which to operate. This is far short of the 12,000 to 15,000 square feet a police department of our size should have to operate effectively.

In closing, I would like to thank the staff of the police department for their dedication and commitment to their department and to their community. I would also like to thank the residents of the community who continue to support us.

Thanks, too, to the Board of Selectmen, Town Administrator John Griffin, the Finance Committee, the town's fire departments and their chiefs, Highway Superintendent Phil Sampson and his staff, and all the other town offices and departments for their cooperation throughout the year.

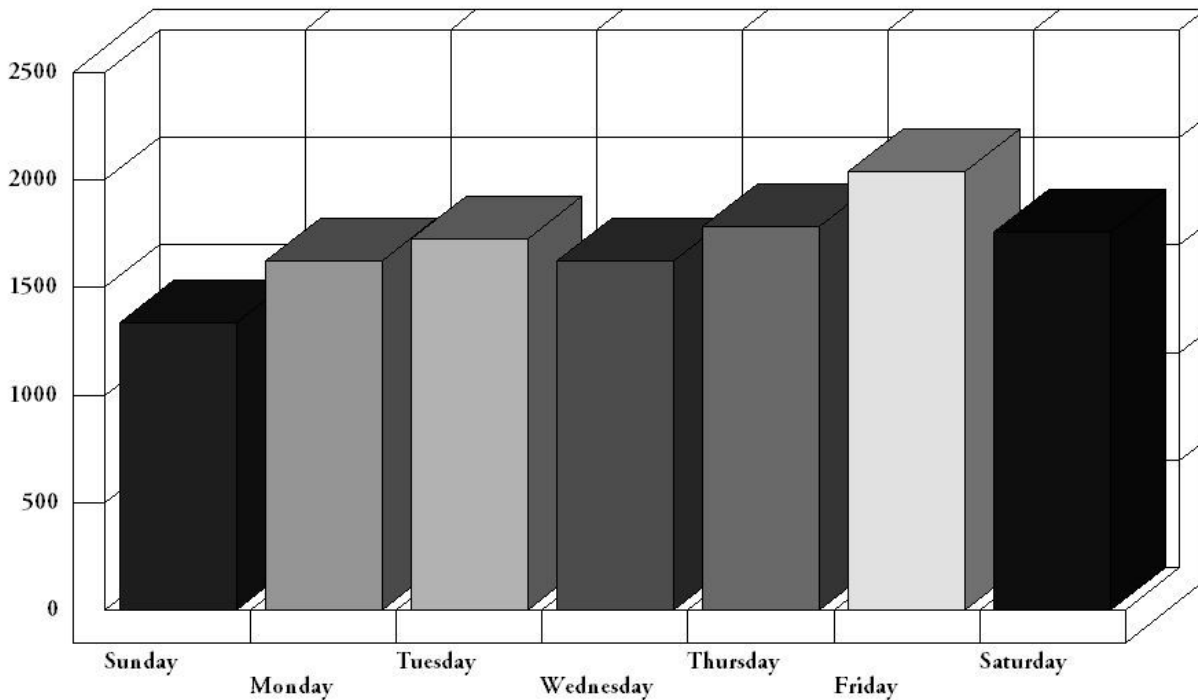

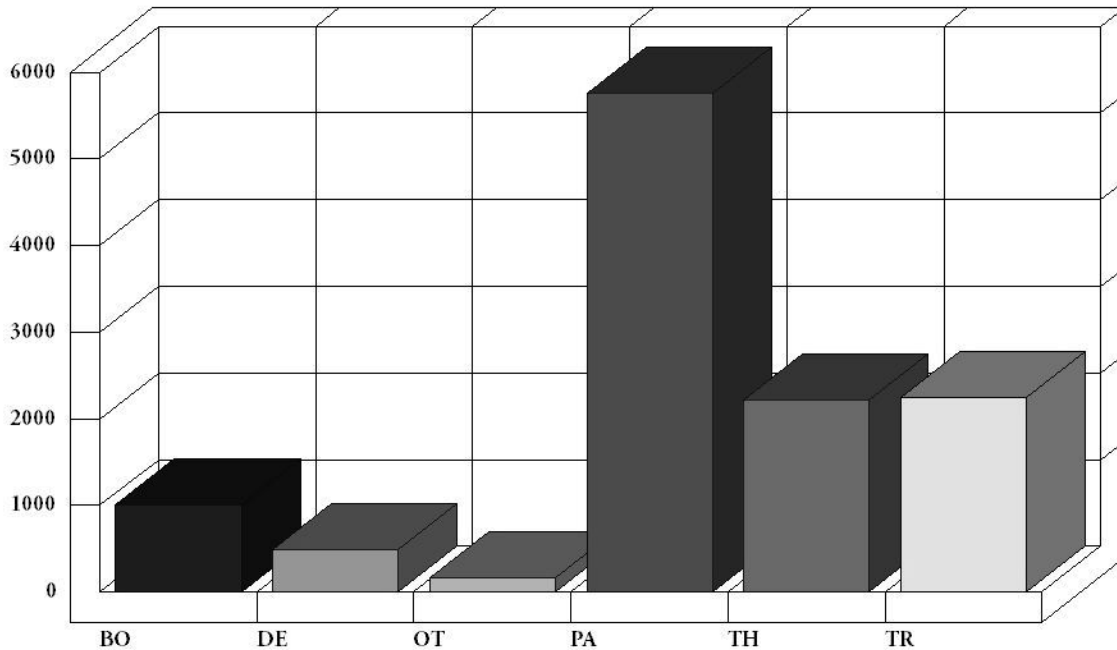
**CALLS BY DAY OF WEEK – 2001**

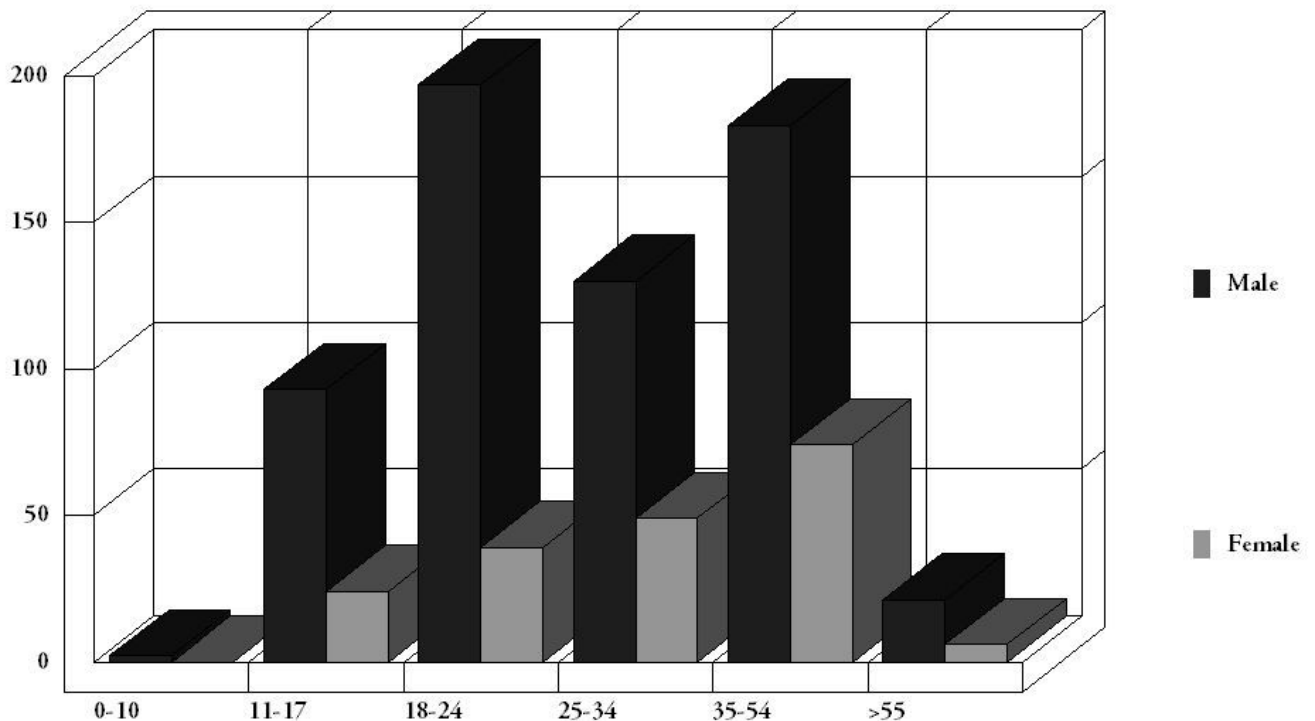

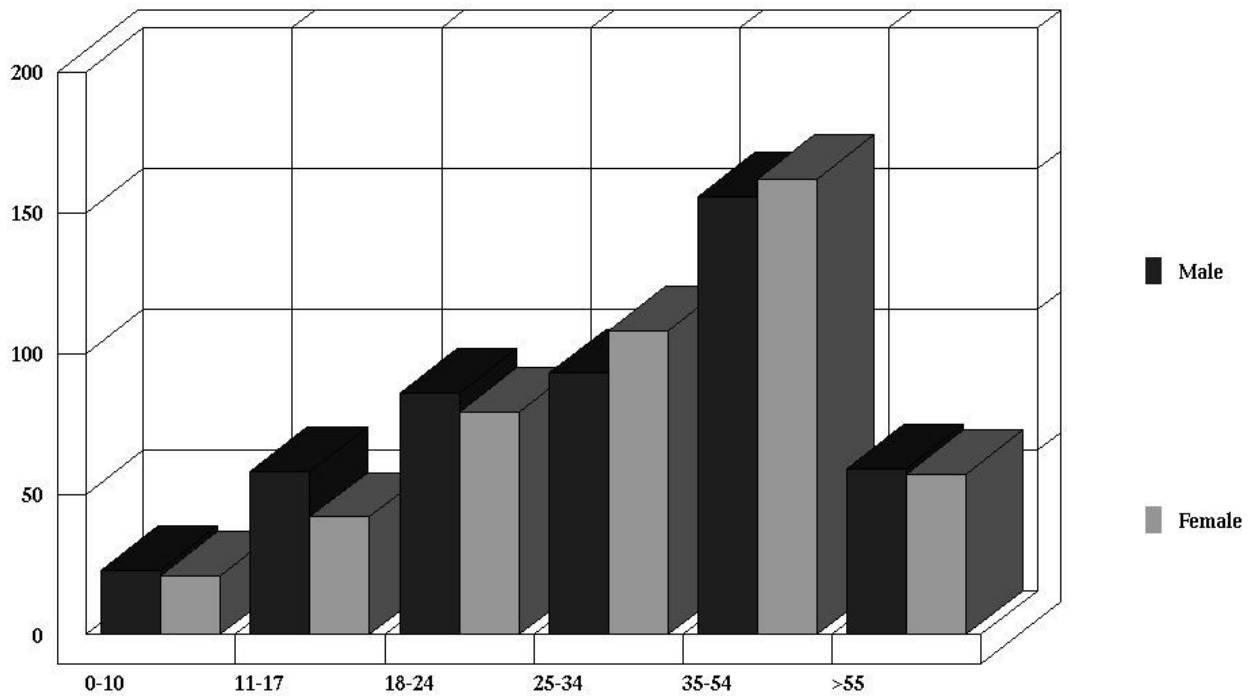
**ARRESTEE BY AGE AND SEX – 2001**

**VICTIM BY AGE AND SEX – 2001**

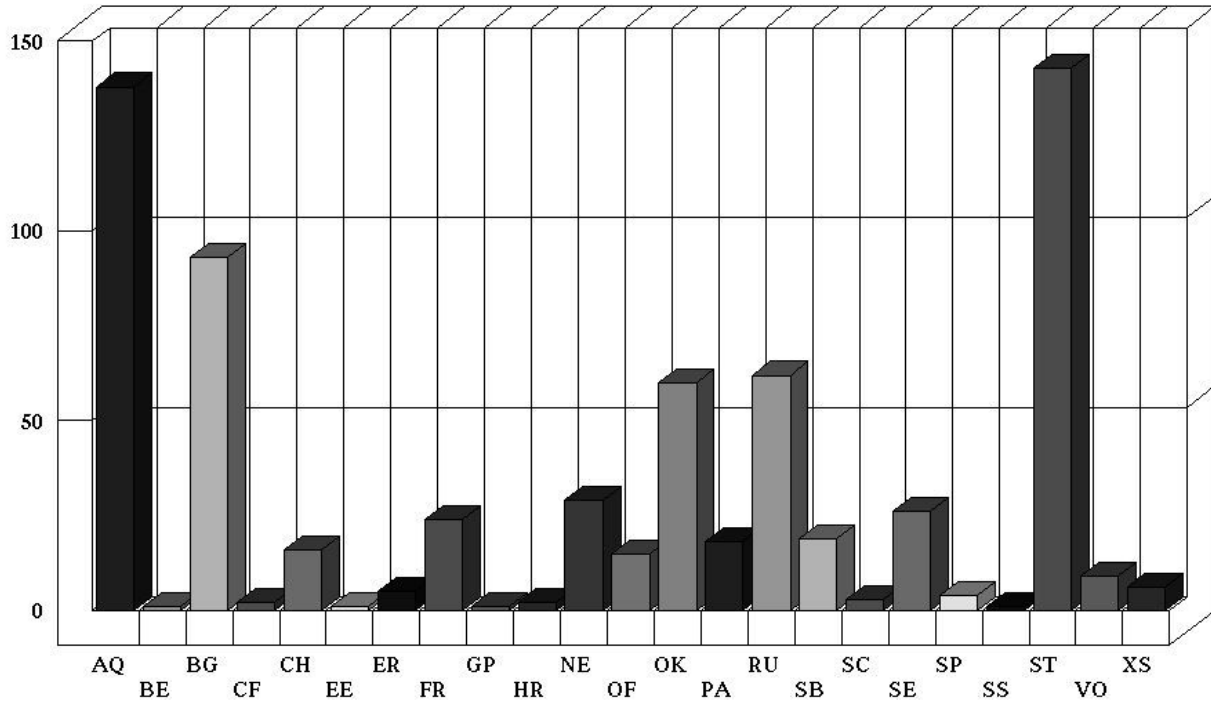
